Other requirements include progressive experience in academic administration, a demonstrated commitment to shared academic governance, strong skills in management of financial and human resources, the ability to make strategic budget and operational decisions that maximize resources, and outstanding verbal and written communication skills.

Augusta State University:


Founded in 1783, Augusta State University is a unique blend of the old and the new, the traditional and the innovative. The University has three colleges: the Katherine Reese Pamplin College of Arts and Sciences, the James M. Hull College of Business, and the College of Education. Well-known for its dedication to expanding educational opportunities for people of all ages and backgrounds, the University places a special emphasis on service to residents of the Central Savannah River Area.

Serving nearly 7,000 students, the University combines a strong liberal arts tradition with practical hands-on application. More than 60 associate's, bachelor's, master's, and specialist's degree programs are offered. The University has an



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Honors Program, and students also have opportunities for internships and study abroad programs.

Of the 200 full-time faculty, 70 percent hold the terminal degree in their field. While the overall student-to-faculty ratio is 19:1, most courses in a student's major average 12 students.

The early 21st century has seen substantial development of the campus, with about \$103 million in new construction and technology. The newer buildings include the Science Hall, Allgood Hall, University Hall, the Jaguar Student Activities Center, and the D. Douglas Bernard Jr. Amphitheatre.

Augusta State's athletic programs compete at the Division II level in the Peach Belt Conference of the NCAA, except for the men's and women's golf programs, both of which are NCAA Division I Independents. In June 2011, the highly competitive men's golf team won its second consecutive national Division I championship. Other athletic programs include men's baseball;

women's softball and volleyball; and men's and women's basketball, cheerleading, cross-country, and tennis.

Nestled on the banks of the mighty Savannah River, Augusta, also known as Augusta-Richmond County, is a consolidated city in Georgia. Known worldwide for the Masters® golf tournament and the coveted green jacket, Augusta is the second largest and second oldest city in Georgia.

The city has two sports teams: the Augusta GreenJackets baseball and the Riverhawks hockey.
