The Opportunity

The Major Gifts Officer plays a key role in securing substantial financial resources and gifts that enable the University to accomplish its mission and achieve its strategic goals. This development officer is responsible for providing administrative support for all major and planned giving efforts at the University by annually managing a portfolio of 125 to 200 major and planned giving prospects. Additionally, this officer assists in the administration and maintenance of all policies and procedures for accepting major and planned gifts.

Other responsibilities include:

- Collaborating closely with the Assistant Vice President of Major and Planned Gifts to design, plan, and implement an aggressive marketing program to identify, cultivate, solicit, and effectively steward major gifts from alumni and friends of the University
- Preparing and presenting proposals and solicitation materials for prospects
- Meeting and working with prospects in both one-on-one and group settings
- Identifying individuals who may be amenable to investing in the University
- Designing and implementing a program to bring selected alumni and friends to the campus and to visit on an annual basis

- Establishing annual goals for identifying new individual prospects
- Establishing a program designed to increase the size of gifts received from alumni and friends and to secure additional gifts from those individuals
- Developing cultivation and solicitation strategies, in cooperation with the Prospect Management Committee, to move donors to higher giving levels through the use of Moves Management strategies
- Developing and implementing a marketing strategy, including workshops, dialogues, and one-on-one meetings
- Planning and implementing an aggressive planned giving program in collaboration with other major gift team members
- Hosting regular seminars focused on financial planning, wealth management, and deferred giving, and managing volunteer leaders as assigned
- Tracking and recording all major gift prospect activities in the Raiser's Edge database system as outlined by departmental policies and procedures

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Qualifications

Candidate should possess at minimum a bachelor's degree, with a master's degree in non-profit management or philanthropic studies, public administration, marketing/public relations, or a related field preferred. A Certified Fund Raising Executive (CFRE) and/or licensed insurance agent is a plus.

Candidate also must have three to five years of experience in major gifts solicitation. Considerable knowledge of CASE and/or AFP fundraising concepts, techniques, and practices are required.

Other requirements include:

- A working knowledge and demonstrated ability to operate computer and various software, i.e. Microsoft Word, Excel, the Internet, Raiser's Edge, PowerPoint, Publisher, etc.
- A demonstrated ability to take initiative and to work independently as well as a team member
- Strong organizational skills
- Effective communication skills, both written and verbal
- A strong ability to multi-task
- A demonstrated ability to be flexible and adaptable to changes that may occur
- The ability and willingness to travel

Claflin University

Founded in 1869, Claflin University is the oldest historically black institution of higher education in South Carolina. The independent, four-year, liberal arts university is affiliated with the United Methodist Church and is recognized as one of the premier liberal arts institutions in the nation.

In 2014, *U.S. News & World Report* ranked Claflin as the 9th best HBCU in the nation, and *Washington Monthly* named the institution the best liberal arts college in South Carolina.

With an enrollment of approximately 2,000 students, Claflin has a student-faculty ratio of 14:1. Nearly 80 percent of the University's 117 full-time faculty members hold terminal degrees in their respective fields.

Claflin University Guiding Principles

At the center of everything the University does is a system of values informing and guiding all policies and programs. These values, expressed through Claflin's decisions and actions, are defined by five overarching guiding principles:

- Commitment to Excellence through doing things better and differently.

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Claflin's 12 academic departments are housed in four academic schools: School of Business, School of Education, School of Humanities and Social Sciences, and School of Natural Sciences and Mathematics. Students can pursue 35 undergraduate majors.

The University also offers three dualdegree programs:


- Engineering (3+2 with Clemson University)
- Engineering Technology (3+2 with South Carolina State University)
- Biology/Public Health (4 + 1 with the University of South Carolina)

Two graduate programs are available: Master of Business Administration and Master of Science in Biotechnology.

Claflin is a member of the Southern Intercollegiate Athletic Conference of the NCAA (Division II). The University fields nine intercollegiate teams. The men's sports include basketball, baseball, tennis, and track and field. Programs for women include basketball, softball, volleyball, tennis, and track and field.
