## THE OPPORTUNITY

Middle Georgia State College has five campuses across central Georgia. Each campus has premier educational facilities and provides students with technology-rich learning environments.

The College's six schools and numerous academic programs offer a wide array of certificate, associate, and baccalaureate programs. Students can select from traditional liberal arts courses to professional programs to flight and aviation studies.

In January 2014, Dr. Christopher Blake became President. He brought almost three decades of teaching and administrative experience in higher education to Middle Georgia State, including seven years as a college president.

Under President Blake's leadership, the College is transitioning from a state college to a state university. With an emerging new strategic plan, graduate programs and alternative adult programs soon will be offered.

The Vice Provost will have a significant

role in working closely with the entire college community in these processes.

Reporting directly to the Provost, the Vice Provost is a member of the Provost's leadership team and serves as the chief academic officer in the absence of the Provost. This academic administrator is a dynamic, energetic, collaborative, and visionary leader.

- Providing strategic leadership in the area of data analytics, analyses, data integrity, and predictive analytics in order to build a culture of actionable, data-driven conversations and decisions at the institution
- Overseeing SACSCOC accreditation and reporting requirements and participating in the supporting academic school discipline specific accrediting responsibilities, such as ABET, NLNC, and TEAC
- Assisting with the oversight, implementation, and evaluation of the Institution's Strategic Plan

- Serving in a leadership role with planning, innovative special initiatives, and system-wide campus initiatives
- Representing the College at academic and civic events, as needed

## QUALIFICATIONS

Candidates must have an earned doctorate from a regionally accredited institution and evidence of successive academic administrative and supervisory experiences.

## THE COLLEGE

Middle Georgia State College is a focused baccalaureate institution with resources dedicated to the advancement of a 17-county region in the central area of Georgia. The College, which was created in January 2013 through the consolidation of two existing colleges,

Macon State and Middle Georgia colleges, is strongly committed to quality education and student success through excellence and innovation in teaching.

A highly flexible and dynamic institution, MGSC actively recruits faculty, staff, and administrators with the experience and talent to sustain a supportive and productive learning environment for a diverse student population. Scholarly pursuits are encouraged with emphasis on applied research related to regional issues, the College's core disciplines, and institutional effectiveness.

While student housing is provided at three of the College's five campuses, the special needs of a commuting population also are recognized in the design and delivery of counseling, testing, career planning, and placement services.

With campuses in Macon, Cochran, Dublin, Eastman, and Warner Robins and a total enrollment of more than 8,100 students, no other college has the reach that Middle Georgia State College has across central Georgia. The average student age is 26. Minority students comprise more than one-third of the student body.

With day, evening, and online classes, Middle Georgia State College offers 20 bachelor's degrees, nearly three dozen associate's degrees, as well as career programs. More than two dozen certificates also are offered, 18 of which are related to the aviation industry. The College is developing a strong online presence.

Academic programs are market-driven and focus on the economic development needs of the community. They are designed to enhance the educational, economic, and cultural lives of Central Georgians. The majority of students

## The Five Campuses of Middle Georgia State College

The **Macon Campus** is located on 419 acres in Bibb County, an hour south of Atlanta. State-of-the-art academic facilities surround the campus lake. The campus has 4,200 students and a 330-bed residence hall. The campus is home to the Waddell Barnes Botanical Gardens. A \$7 million student recreation and wellness center opened in 2014.

The **Cochran Campus** is in Bleckley County. Known for its traditional quad, a scenic lake, and stately oaks, the 182-acre campus has 1,800 students and on-campus housing for 1,195 students. The college's intercollegiate athletic program is based here. The campus also is home to the Georgia Academy of Aviation, Mathematics, Engineering & Science (GAMES), a select and elite educational program for 11th and 12th graders, and a Post-Secondary Readiness Enrichment Program (PREP).

The **Dublin Campus** is in Laurens County and has 700 commuting students. Programs on the 49-acre campus lead to associate's degrees, including the associate of science in nursing. The campus is expected to grow significantly in the next few years.

The **Eastman Campus** in Dodge County is home to the college's School of Aviation and is devoted almost entirely to aviation programs. It is the only campus in the University System of Georgia that has flight training and airport management programs. Located adjacent to the Heart of Georgia Regional Airport, the 22-acre campus includes five acres of buildings. Five hangars are located in the main building for storage and maintenance of a fleet of aircraft used in training and instruction, as well as an aircraft terminal and tower. With a student body of 500 and student housing for 140, the campus offers bachelor's and associate's degrees and certificates related to aviation.

The 72-acre **Warner Robins Campus** in Houston County is a half mile from the main gate of Robins Air Force Base. Two acres are currently devoted to building space, which means plenty of room for future expansion in what is one of Georgia's fastest growing counties. The campus currently serves 1,600 students and, in addition to classrooms, has a bookstore, academic resource center, a fitness center, and café.

remain in the region after graduation, providing needed knowledge and skills for the area's economic development growth.

Through its six academic schools, the College prepares students to compete in a technologically advanced global economy while developing important life skills and receiving a firm foundation in the liberal arts.

The College offers a wide array of Student Life and Recreation and Wellness programs. Services, facilities, and student organizations are designed to promote campus spirit and community connection.

More than 60 student organizations, from social and cultural groups to academic-based associations to service-oriented clubs, provide students opportunities to develop a sense of community and lasting relationships. Concerts, theatrical productions, and lectures are held throughout the year.

The MGSC Knights intercollegiate athletic program has men's and women's basketball, soccer, and tennis, men's baseball, and women's softball. Intramural and club sports are available in football, basketball, tennis, and competitive cheerleading.

## MACON, GEORGIA

The main campus of the College is located in Macon, Georgia. Considered a blend of progressive thinking and a respect for history, Macon offers large-city amenities and true Southern charm. The population of the city is approximately 156,000, with the metropolitan area almost 230,000.

Located 70 miles south of Atlanta, Macon is a popular tourist destination. Notable attractions include the International



Cherry Blossom Festival, the Tubman African American Museum, the Georgia Sports Hall of Fame, and the Museum of Arts and Sciences.

Cultural arts are strongly supported by the community, with five performing arts theatres. The historic Grand Opera House offers Broadway shows and is home to

the Macon Symphony Orchestra and the Macon Symphony Youth Orchestra.

The area's health care offerings are among the best in the state, including three major hospitals and heart, cancer, and transplant facilities. Macon's Children's Hospital serves more than 45,000 children annually.
