Brief History of LeTourneau University

Businessman and devout Christian R.G. LeTourneau, one of the world's greatest inventors, toured Longview, Texas, with his wife, Evelyn, in 1946 to consider a manufacturing site for his next factory. While flying over a sprawling Army hospital, Mrs. LeTourneau inquired about the facility. When told it was no longer in use, she suggested establishing a school to educate returning World War II veterans. In 1946, the site became LeTourneau Technical Institute.

Today, LeTourneau University is a comprehensive interdenominational Christian university, with recognized professional programs. Undergraduate degrees are awarded in engineering, technology, the liberal arts, business, aeronautical science, social sciences, education, and the sciences, plus master's degrees in business, engineering and education.

The University has more than 3,200 students. Over 1,500 students are enrolled at the 162-acre main campus in Longview. In addition, the University serves 1,650 students through business, education and psychology degree programs online and at Texas education centers in Bedford, Dallas, Houston, Tyler and Austin.



Provost and Executive Vice President



LeTourneau University, an interdenominational, evangelical Christ-centered institution of higher learning, seeks an exceptional academic administrator with a distinguished record of teaching, scholarship and leadership to serve as Provost and Executive Vice President. The senior officer will provide visionary direction and will be responsible for the planning, development and administration of the academic mission of the University. The Provost and Executive Vice President reports directly to the President and serves as the chief executive officer in the absence of the President.

Primary Responsibilities

Serving as the chief academic officer, the Provost and Executive Vice President has far-reaching, executive-level responsibilities and duties across the University. Among the responsibilities of the position are:

- To plan and lead the administration of the academic initiatives in the University's Strategic Plan (see page 3)
- To provide strategic direction to the University's six academic schools, the library and a number of offices, including registrar, research

and scholarship, sponsored programs, international studies, and instructional technology

- To oversee the recruitment, development, and performance of school deans, academic administrators, and faculty, and be responsible for the University's promotion and tenure process
- To model the integration of faith and learning, and engage the broader evangelical Christian community to embrace the holy calling and eternal impact possible in every workplace in every nation



Qualifications

The Provost and Executive Vice President should be a visionary leader with an earned doctorate, preferably a Ph.D., from a regionally accredited institution. The individual should possess a mature and contagious relationship with Jesus Christ, enthusiastically support LeTourneau's mission and faith statements, and be willing to adhere to the University's lifestyle standards.

Other qualities and experiences include:



The University also offers programs in business, education and psychology online and at educational centers across Texas in Austin, Bedford, Dallas, Houston and Tyler.

The university aviation program was just named the nation's best by the National Intercollegiate Flying Association. LeTourneau certifies more classroom teachers than any other independent university in Texas. The faculty leading these recognized professional programs are committed to quality teaching and scholarship. Since 2000, LeTourneau University faculty have been awarded more than \$ 10,000,000 in sponsored project

funding from sources such as NSF, NIH and the State of Texas.

LeTourneau University is consistently recognized by U.S. News and World Report as one of "America's Best Colleges." It has been honored for distinguished community service by being named to the President's Higher Education Community Service Honor Roll for exemplary service efforts.

Committed to being a global university, LeTourneau embraces diversity. Students, faculty and staff reflect a variety of ethnicities, races, and geographical backgrounds. All 50 states and 22 different countries are represented in the student body.

Further expansion of global programs

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is a strategic priority. A new Center for Global Service Learning will build on the international success of LEGS-a unique collaboration of faculty and students that engineers lowcost, sustainable prosthetics for the developing world.

Entering freshmen averages of SAT scores are approximately 140-160 points above the national average. In Fall 2010, nine new National Merit Scholars enrolled at LeTourneau, giving the University a total of 22 scholars.

LeTourneau is known for graduating students who exhibit a strong work ethic, character and immediate effectiveness in the marketplace, across the nation and around the world. The University's three-year average graduate placement rate is 91 percent overall.

At LeTourneau, athletics is a vital and integral part of the educational process. LeTourneau is a member of the American Southwest Conference, NCAA Division III. More than 200 student athletes participate in the six Men's sports - baseball, basketball, cross-county, golf, soccer and tennis and seven Women's sports – basketball, cross-country, golf, soccer, softball, tennis and volleyball.

The Longview campus is primarily residential. More than 85 percent of

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the students participate in one or more of the intramural sports.

About Longview, Texas

The 162-acre main campus is located in Longview, Texas, a progressive hub city with an MSA of 200,000, nestled among the beautiful pine-forested hills and lakes of East Texas. Longview is approximately 120 miles east of Dallas, Texas, and 60 miles west of Shreveport, Louisiana.

The business and cultural hub for the area, Longview has a symphony, public library, museums, movie theaters, a community theater, an opera, two hospitals, a mall and several shopping centers. Nearby are several lakes where fishing and camping are favorite activities. Mild winters and colorful springs and autumns provide a perfect setting for the high quality of life found in Longview.

In 2008, Longview was named one of the "100 Best Communities for Young People" by America's Promise Alliance, which reviewed five features of the community: caring adults, safe places, a healthy start, effective education, and opportunities to help others.
