The University of Louisiana at Monroe, a comprehensive, state-funded institution of higher education, seeks an outstanding nursing scholar and educator to serve as the Kitty DeGree Eminent Scholars Endowed Chair. Holding the rank of Associate Professor or Professor, this scholar will teach nursing courses and continue a defined research agenda.

THE OPPORTUNITY

The Kitty DeGree Eminent Scholars Endowed Chair is a distinction awarded by the university to a scholar or teacher in recognition of past and potential original contributions to the individual's academic discipline. In addition to the academic honor given to the holder, the endowed chair provides funding for support of the faculty member's teaching, research, and service responsibilities.

The recipient of this endowed chair will represent the highest caliber of researcher, academic scholar, and educator. This distinguished faculty member will contribute to the advancement of the nursing profession and the future of the school and its students through outstanding teaching and research.

Part of the College of Health and Pharmaceutical Sciences, the Kitty DeGree School of Nursing has a long history of excellence. Founded in 1960, the School graduated the first class of baccalaureate nurses in 1964.

Baccalaureate nursing graduates at ULM receive education in all aspects of nursing care and are prepared to work in a variety of health care environments. Their academic program includes a broad-based general educational foundation inclusive of history, English, science, and arts.

Six times since 2008, ULM nursing graduates have had a 100 percent first-time passage rate on the NCLEX. CollegeStart.org ranks the school's online RN-to-BSN Program #1 in the nation for best value for 2016-2017.

In 2014, the School of Nursing was ranked ninth among nursing schools in the nation by CollegeAtlas.org in its "A-List," a list of top United States Nursing Schools. The ranking is based



on affordability, academic quality, accessibility, and board exam pass rates.

The School's Graduate Nursing Program offers a Master of Science in Nursing (MSN) degree with a focus on Gerontological Clinical Nurse Leader. This online degree program prepares graduates for management decisionmaking skills required by healthcare agencies providing care for gerontology patients.

The MSN program provides students with management skills, including human resource management, fiscal management, and quality management to improve health care outcomes for older patients in a variety of health care settings.

The School of Nursing is accredited by CCNE and approved by the Louisiana State Board of Nursing.
