Valdosta State University, a comprehensive state university serving primarily southern Georgia, seeks applications and nominations for the position of **Associate Dean of the School of Nursing** in the College of Nursing and Health Sciences. Appointment date for this 12-month, tenure-track administrative faculty position is negotiable, but no later than July 1, 2019.

The Opportunity

Valdosta State University is a regional institution of the University System of Georgia and serves more than 11,200 undergraduate and graduate students. The campus is situated just north of the Georgia-Florida state line on I-75.

Through excellence in teaching, basic and applied research, and service, VSU provides rigorous programs and opportunities that enrich its students, the university, and the region. All VSU faculty share the responsibility of teaching courses at multiple levels as needed in their respective disciplines. To carry out the institution's comprehensive mission, the University seeks faculty with the desire and ability to successfully engage students as they launch or continue their intellectual journey.

Offering 57 undergraduate and 60+ graduate degrees, including five doctorates, VSU has eight academic units: the College of Arts; Langdale College of Business Administration; James L. and Dorothy H. Dewar College of Education

and Human Services; College of Humanities and Social Sciences; College of Nursing and Health Sciences; College of Science and Mathematics; Graduate School; and Honors College.

Valdosta State accepted its first class of nursing students in Fall 1968. Development of the program was facilitated by a request from Pineview General Hospital, which later became South Georgia Medical Center, for help preparing registered nurses for the region.

VSU's School of Nursing today is part of the College of Nursing and Health Sciences. The School offers three degree programs.

Bachelor of Science in Nursing

- BSN Basic Licensure
- Accelerated BSN for holders of Bachelor's degrees in other fields

Master of Science in Nursing

MSN with concentrations in Family Psychiatric Mental Health Nursing Practitioner, Family Nurse Practitioner, and Adult Gerontology Nurse Practitioner

The School also offers a pathway for registered nurses to earn either a BSN or MSN degree.

The College of Nursing and **Health Sciences**

The College of Nursing and Health Sciences (CONHS) serves more than 1,100 students and provides programs of study at the undergraduate and graduate level. Faculty members are actively involved in research, service, scholarship, and professional development.

The Bachelor of Science degree is granted in Exercise Physiology, Athletic Training, and Nursing. Graduate programs include the Master of Science in Exercise Physiology and in Nursing. An Associate of Applied Science degree in Dental Hygiene is offered in collaboration with Wiregrass Technical College. A minor in Nutritional Science is offered fully online.

Faculty members are actively involved in research, service, scholarship, and professional development. The College has 30 full-time and 8 part-time instructional faculty.

The health professions programs are housed in the University's \$32-million



Health Sciences and Business Administration Building. The recently constructed 150,000-square-foot facility allows students and faculty to engage in cross-disciplinary discussions and research in addition to expanding interaction with health professionals at South Georgia Medical Center and other health agencies.

The Nursing programs are accredited by CCNE. The Athletic Training program is accredited by CAATE. The Exercise Physiology program is accredited by CAAHEP. The Dental Hygiene program is accredited by CODA.

The Position

The Associate Dean position provides an excellent opportunity for an experienced nursing educator to lead a strong, growing program. The University seeks an academic leader who possesses the communication, administrative, and leadership skills to maintain a supportive and student-centered learning and working environment.

Reporting directly to the Dean of the College of Nursing and Health Sciences, the Associate Dean, in collaboration with program directors, faculty, staff, and students, is responsible for the following:

- Managing the School of Nursing (SON) budget.
- Using effective and ongoing written and oral communication.
- Modeling the core values of the Blazer Creed: civility, citizenship, and integrity.
- Maintaining accreditation with regional and national organizations.
- Developing and promoting a rigorous curriculum that is evidencebased, incorporating innovative teaching.
- Communicating a clear vision for the SON.
- Working collaboratively with the School of Health Sciences and programs outside of the College of Nursing and Health Sciences for the purposes of collaborative teaching and scholarly initiatives.
- Collaboratively developing, refining, and implementing appropriate policies within the SON.
- Developing a strategic plan for the SON that aligns with the strategic plans of the college and of the institution.

Sheri R. Noviello, RN, PhD **Dean of the College of Nursing and Health Sciences** and Professor of Nursing



Dr. Sheri Noviello joined VSU in 2014 as an Associate Dean of the College of Nursing and Health Sciences and was named interim Dean soon afterwards. She was appointed to Dean of the College of Nursing and Health Sciences and Professor of Nursing in 2016.

Prior to VSU, Dr. Noviello held faculty and leadership positions at Columbus State University from 1991 to 2014. She rose through the academic ranks within the School of Nursing, from instructor to Director of the Nursing Program and tenured professor. She received the Dean's Award for Innovation in 2012 from the College of Education and Health Professions, a Governor's Teaching Fellowship from 2006 to 2007, and a Most Outstanding Senior Professor Award in 2006.

Dr. Noviello holds a BSN degree from Columbus College in Georgia, and a MSN degree, with a focus on adult health and education, from Troy State University in Alabama, with post-master's

training in pediatrics. She earned her PhD degree from the Medical College of Georgia (now Augusta University).

Her research has appeared in such professional publications as the Journal of Emergency Nursing and Nurse Educator. She has secured funding for a number of research and outreach projects and is a regular presenter at the local, state, national, and international level.

Qualifications

Candidates must hold a doctorate in nursing or a closely related field. Experience teaching in baccalaureate and/or graduate nursing programs, a record of scholarship, evidence of academic leadership, and credentials consistent with the appointment in senior rank as an associate or full professor are required.

Preferred candidates will have:

- Experience in academic administration
- Recent knowledge and experience with accreditation, preferably as a Commission on College Nursing Education (CCNE) evaluator

Other requirements include:

- Demonstrated commitment to excellence in teaching and learning, as well as scholarship
- Commitment to diversity and inclusion
- Commitment to shared governance and collaborative leadership
- Current or eligibility for licensure as a registered nurse in the State of Georgia

The University offers the extensive academic, cultural and social opportunities of a major university; yet, the small classes and close personal attention found at smaller institutions.

Students are attracted to the close-knit community where learning occurs in a supportive, student-centered environment.

VSU has 415 full-time faculty, and 80 percent of professors have the terminal degree in their field of study. The average class size is 22 students, so faculty-student engagement is active. Approximately 14 percent of students attend fully online.

While Georgians comprise 89.7 percent of VSU's total enrollment, all 50 states, the District of Columbia, three U.S. territories, and 67 countries are represented in the student body.

The Valdosta State philosophy embraces the concept that the measurement of a student's success in college goes beyond the classroom and offers a wide array of opportunities to become involved. Students can choose from more than 200 active student organizations, Greek fraternities and sororities, faith-based ministry groups, a variety of intramural teams, and many service and academic clubs.
