

ABOUT THE UNIVERSITY

Utah Valley University is an open-enrollment, dual-mission institution located in Orem, Utah, that serves as an integrated university and community college. Its focus is on engaged teaching and learning through hands-on activities, community engagement, and faculty-guided student research.

UVU is committed to preparing all students and employees for success in an increasingly complex, diverse, and globalized society. It promotes civility and respect for the dignity and potential of each individual. It seeks to advance understanding of diverse perspectives, and values and promotes collegial relationships and mutual respect among students, faculty, and staff. UVU works to address the needs of populations that are underrepresented and students with varying levels of academic preparation. In all its endeavors, the university strives for excellence.

At UVU, the administration, faculty, and staff believe everyone deserves the transforming benefits of high-quality education that is affordable, accessible, and flexible. With opportunities to earn credentials ranging from certificates to master's degrees, UVU students succeed by gaining real-world experience and developing career-ready skills. UVU's invitation to students is: "Come as you are—and leave prepared to make a difference in the world."

Established in 1941 as Central Utah Vocational School with the primary function of providing war production training, UVU has grown and evolved over the past 80 years to meet the ever-changing educational and technical needs of the community, region, and state. The institution has transformed from a vocational school to a trade technical institute, then a technical college, community college, state college and, in 2008, a comprehensive university offering master's degree programs.

Today, UVU serves over 41,000 students across seven colleges and schools: College of Engineering and Technology, College of Health and Public Service, College of Humanities and Social Sciences, College of Science, School of Education, School of the Arts, and Woodbury School of Business. The university offers 211 degree options—11 master's, 91 bachelor's, 65 associate's, and 44 certificates.

Facilities span a combined total of 412 acres with 50 buildings on campuses in Orem, Provo, and Heber City, along with new developments in Vineyard and Lehi. Throughout its history, UVU has responded to its service region's (Utah, Wasatch, and Summit counties) population changes and business and industry needs.

WOODBURY SCHOOL OF BUSINESS

Utah Valley University's Woodbury School of Business (WSB) is one of the largest accredited business schools in the nation. It is accredited by the Association to Advance Collegiate Schools of Business (AACSB) and has undergraduate and graduate programs.

WSB offers a comprehensive curriculum at the undergraduate level, with 16 bachelor's degree programs, five associate degrees, nine minors, and six certificates. These programs include traditional disciplines, such as business management, finance, accounting, and marketing, as well as specific business-related offerings, such as including digital marketing, sales, risk management and insurance, entrepreneurship, human resource management, and operations and supply chain management. A particular point of pride at the undergraduate level is a nationally recognized program in Personal Financial Planning.

At the master's level, WSB offers an MBA, a Master of Accountancy (MAcc) that leads to the CPA designation, and Master of Financial Planning and Analytics that results in students qualifying with the CFP and/or CFA designations. At both the graduate and undergraduate levels, industry certificates are an important part of the curricular offering.

Serving over 5,000 student majors, the school involves more than 1,200 students every year in significant engaged-learning experiences, including consulting projects, study abroad, competitions, internships, entrepreneurial ventures, mentored research, and other activities which enable students to put theory into practice. By connecting students with industry on a regular basis, the WSB's award-winning faculty help students grow in both confidence and competence. At the same time, the faculty increase their own knowledge of the relationship between practice and theory, making them more effective teachers. The WSB employs more than 120 full-time faculty and staff as well as approximately 150 part-time faculty and staff each semester.

The Woodbury School of Business is named for a leading Utah business family with operations in Utah and throughout the region. An endowment of more than \$20 million provides resources to experiment with new initiatives that benefit students and create stronger links to industry. Over the past several years, faculty members have used these resources to build a marketing consulting lab known as The Green House, a technology research lab called the SMARTLab, a

nascent first-year experience for students, an NGO research and training project in Ghana, and a FinTech consulting experience.

As of January 2022, the WSB moved into its new home, a 169,000 square-foot building named for prominent businessman Scott C. Keller. The technologically advanced Keller Building provides over 120 small group rooms where students can work on consulting projects, competition preparation, entrepreneurial ventures, classwork, and other team projects. Further, it houses classrooms built for a variety of pedagogical approaches, including interview rooms, oral presentation rooms, tutoring labs, podcast spaces, a large auditorium, and dedicated labs for engaged learning and pedagogical disruption.

The WSB is located in a rapidly growing region with a robust economy. The Milken Institute ranked Provo/Orem as the #1 Best Performing City in the nation. Utah is ranked as the #1 State for GDP Growth and the #3 Top State for Business. Much of the growth is occurring within the high-tech sector. Silicon Slopes, 20 minutes from UVU's main campus, is the hub of the burgeoning tech and startup community. Headquartered in Lehi, Silicon Slopes is home to Adobe, Domo, Qualtrics, and many other high-profile corporations. Utah Valley University's WSB is a prominent part of that hub, with a campus centrally located in Lehi and a well-established partnership with Silicon Slopes. UVU offers a one-ofa-kind technology-management-emphasis MBA. The partnership provides unparalleled engaged learning and networking opportunities.

Astrid S. Tuminez, Ph.D. Utah Valley University President

Dr. Astrid Tuminez was appointed the seventh president of UVU in 2018 and is the institution's first female president. She brings to UVU a broad and rich experience in academia, philanthropy, technology, and business. Born in a farming village in the Philippine province of Iloilo, she moved with her parents and six siblings to the slums of Iloilo City when she was two years old, her parents seeking better educational opportunities for their children.

Her pursuit of education eventually took her to the United States to Brigham Young University, where she graduated summa cum laude in 1986 with a bachelor's degree in international relations and Russian literature. She earned a master's degree from Harvard University in Soviet Studies (1988) and a Ph.D. from the Massachusetts Institute of Technology in political science (1996).

Before assuming her current position, Dr. Tuminez was Microsoft's regional director for corporate, external, and legal affairs in Southeast Asia. She is also the former vice dean of research at the Lee Kuan Yew School of Public Policy, National University of Singapore; is a permanent member of the Council on Foreign Relations; and is the author of *Russian Nationalism Since 1856: Ideology and the Making of Foreign Policy* and many other publications.



F. Wayne Vaught, Ph.D. Provost and Senior Vice President for Academic Affairs

Dr. Wayne Vaught joined Utah Valley University on June 1, 2019. Prior to his appointment at UVU, Dr. Vaught had a 21-year career at the University of Missouri-Kansas City, where he served as a faculty member and then Dean of the College of Arts and Sciences. Prior to UMKC, he taught at Allegheny University of the Health Sciences (which merged with Drexel University) and Georgetown College in Kentucky.

Dr. Vaught received a doctorate in philosophy and bioethics from the University of Tennessee, and he focused his research on ethical issues in pediatric decision-making. His research and areas of expertise are in bioethics, professional ethics, ethical issues in pediatrics, and cross-cultural conflicts in healthcare.

Orem and Lehi, Utah

Utah Valley University is in the city of Orem in north-central Utah, about 45 miles southeast of Salt Lake City and adjacent to Provo, Lindon, and Vineyard.

Orem is one of the principal cities of the Provo-Orem Metropolitan Area, which has a population of more than 88,000, making it the sixth largest city in Utah. Orem has a dynamic economy, growing employment, and career opportunities. More than 4,000 businesses call the city home. One of its fastest growing industrial sectors is technology companies. Downtown Provo features a variety of restaurants in a pedestrian-friendly setting.

Fifteen minutes from Orem is the city of Lehi. As Utah's sixth oldest city, Lehi is rich in pioneer and old

west history. It is also the fifth fastest-growing city in the country with nearly 60,000 residents, double the population in 2000. The city offers a small-town feel with large-city amenities, low cost of living, diverse forms of entertainment, low crime rates, and great educational opportunities.
